- 3. **Proof of Common-Law Marriage** Please submit one of the following:
 - a. A certified court order, on court stationery, signed by a judge, ruling that you and your spouse (by name) have a valid common-law marriage under the laws of the state in which you reside.
 - b. An official declaration form issued by some states to register an informal marriage. Please contact your attorney if you have any questions on obtaining a court order. The company's legal staff is not authorized to offer legal advice on personal matters.)
 - c. If you and your spouse filed a joint tax return, you may obtain a copy of a prior year's tax return from the IRS, stamped/indicated as a true copy by the IRS. The tax return must show that you and your common-law spouse claim each other as husband and wife.

We cannot accept any other form of proof of common-law marriage.

If your request is approved, information will be sent to your network/claims administrator for eligibility of your common-law spouse's coverage.
